Check Requirements for all Ponds...Even Farm Ponds

Rules and Regulations

There are many federal, state and local rules and regulations governing building a pond and clearing land. Failure to obtain permits from federal, state & local authorities may result in fines and/or legal actions. Permits that may be needed include an Erosion Control Permit, Floodplain Development Permit, 401 Water Quality Certification, and a 404 Permit from the USACE. If you feel you have a suitable pond site and you are planning to clear land, you should contact the following agencies prior to beginning any work.
